



A DAY IN THE LIFE

A Day in the Life of Primary School gives you, the reader, an insight into St. Mary School curriculum*. The curriculum pursues excellence through the National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Elementary and Secondary Schools and the Diocese of Camden's Office of Catholic Schools Curriculum. These standards are mission-driven, program effective, well-managed and responsibly governed while being grounded in Church teachings, best practices, and are proven successful in Catholic education.

The following summarizes the goals and outcomes of our curriculum.

Religion: St. Mary's Religion curriculum is integrated throughout all courses, activities, and daily school life. Students gain an understanding of God's plan of loving goodness, grow in their lifelong relationship through the gift of faith; see the Church as a community of faith; embrace the Sacraments; learn to make moral decisions based on informed Gospel teachings; celebrate Mass, liturgical seasons and learn to live a life of service to others. To enhance religious education and faith formation, St. Mary School introduced a full-time Coordinator of Catholic Identity, Mrs. Allision Filion, to the staff in Sept. 2022.

Performing Arts: All students at St. Mary School experience Art education in all four art disciplines: Dance, Music, Theater, and Visual Arts. Our strong visual and performing arts program offers tools for development and enables intellectual and social development. St. Mary School is the only elementary school in the Diocese to employ a full-time Director of Arts & Integration, Mrs. Toni Burdey. Mrs. Burdey collaborates with faculty to incorporate art in all subject areas.

Physical Education: Physical Education is an integral part of St. Mary School's total education program. It strives to develop qualities which enable students to "play a constructive role in a changing world" through the study of physical, affective, cognitive, and social-emotional development.

Language Arts: Language Arts is the sending and receiving of words and we take care to ensure that students have the technical skills to perform these functions seamlessly - but in its truest form, it is endlessly interesting, soul-searching, and important to consider. It can change an opinion, spark an idea, or provide sustenance to the soul. It can bring unseen values of this world into perfect clarity and spotlight the darker aspects of the human condition. What we read and write lingers. It rests in our thoughts and in our hearts and ultimately changes us word by word so that we become and express God's glory, as St. Irenaeus described: "The glory of God is the human person fully alive."

Math: Primary school students focus on various math components from patterns to fractions. They use logical reasoning in all aspects of



the math curriculum from place value to beginning algebraic functions. They make real-world connections by solving multi-step word problems. They learn math best by "doing math" including all mathematical operations such as addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. The math curriculum is aligned to foster students' academic

growth year to year.

Penmanship & Cursive: The rigors of good penmanship are stressed at all grade levels. Cursive trains the brain to learn functional specialization, it improves memory and improves fine motors skills. Cursive handwriting acts as a connector between letters that form a word. It helps a child to see the letters as a word. Students begin to print in preschool



which is then reinforced in kindergarten and first grade. Cursive is introduced in second grade and is carried through in all grade levels.


3rd Grade

Social Studies: Social

Studies provides a framework for leveraging students' knowledge of current events through holidays and celebrations that are part of our culture. It engages students in the history, rationale, and types of celebrations that hon-

Science: Elementary school students are naturally curious, which makes science an ideal subject for them to learn. Science allows students to explore their world and discover new things. The focus of science is to engage the students in science investigation by asking questions,



collecting, and analyzing data and using this evidence to understand human interaction of humankind with Earth and its many resources. The students learn about cycles; including but not limited to: life cycles, water cycles, rock cycles and the cycles in nature. Students also focus, utilizing their skills of observation, on understanding the relationship between the needs of living things and their environment. Students also look at the various forces in nature and their effect upon the environment.

St. Mary School faculty is committed to nurturing and challenging students and students express their love for learning through creativity, critical thinking and enthusiasm.

Alumni Spotlight

Megan Cullis SMS '09 Arthur P. Schalick High School Northeastern University, Boston, MA



In every issue of The Messenger, we like to bring news about our Alumni and what they are doing since graduating St. Mary School. In this issue, we are spotlighting the courage and endurance of one alum who took the summer to make a once in a lifetime trip – ON FOOT!

In a recent interview, Megan Cullis describes this incredible endeavor that few have ventured to do.

Megan hiked the Pacific Crest Trail in the summer of 2022 from May 9 to September 10. It is a 2,653 mile trail that stretches from Mexico to Canada, passing through the states of California, Oregon, and Washington. She started the hike solo, similar to most thru hikers (thousands of people attempt to hike this trail every year). Even though she started late in the season, Megan was still able to meet lots of people and make friends who formed a "trail family".

Megan carried everything she needed in her backpack, including a tent, sleeping bag, water filter, and food. Every 4-6 days or so, she would hop off the trail and go into town to resupply her food, take a shower, charge her devices, and try to call home. There was no cell phone service for most sections of the trail, but Megan carried a Garmin InReach satellite communicator which allowed her to message her mom every night. It also has an SOS feature to contact Search & Rescue in the event that she needed help.

Megan is incredibly grateful for having the opportunity to hike this trail, which was a dream of her for years. Megan said, "It was beautiful and challenging in ways that I hadn't even expected". There were quite a few fire closures that required detours, in particular, there was one in northern Washington that forced her to turn around and end the hike just 180 miles short of the northern terminus. While Megan didn't technically "finish" this year at the Canadian border, she still hiked over 2,000 miles. Next summer, Megan plans to go back and finish the remaining miles. Megan reflected that she is so thankful for her family and friends who supported her throughout the journey.

Prior to her adventure, Megan received a MA with a B.S. in Biology from North Eastern University and resides in Utah training for a Wilderness First Responder Certification which is medical training for outdoor educators and guides pursing a career in outdoor education.

Here is another glimpse into one of St. Mary School's Alumni who certainly is living out the mission of St. Mary's everyday. Allyson (McMahan) Boucher currently lives in Washington, DC with her husband, Eric and two daughters Hannah & Violet age 7 and 4. Allyson is the Communications Director for Children's Law Center in Washington DC.

We recently reached out to Allyson for a little Q & A and here is what she had to say:

Q: Can you tell us a little about where you have worked and or volunteered since entering the workforce?

A: I've been fortunate to find three places that I loved working over the course of my career. All three focused on using marketing and communications to make a difference and more recently in working to fight against social injustice.

I first worked with National 4-H Council, bringing my passion growing up as a 4-H member to raise awareness of the organization nationally. I then oversaw communications and advocacy campaigns for dozens of nonprofits across the country as part of a communications agency. Those two jobs gave me the strong foundation I needed to take on my current position: Communications Director for Children's Law Center, a DC-based nonprofit that works to improve the lives of children and families in the District through free legal support and city-wide advocacy.

Q: You have much to be proud of. Can you share with us two or three things that you were part of that you are most proud?

A: I am happy I took a chance and joined AmeriCorps directly out of college. It gave me the opportunity to live on the West Coast for a year and work on a variety of volunteer efforts – from Habitat for Humanity outside of San Francisco, CA to teaching in a public school in Tucson, AZ.

But my job today is by far the most rewarding and challenging. I get to share the stories of children and families who face some of the biggest barriers created by historic injustices and oppression and highlight how the lawyers I work with fight every day to ensure their voices are heard. This includes advocating for landlords to fix issues like mold in a child's home, ensuring students with disabilities are receiving the education they deserve and working to obtain financial support for

parents to provide for their children. It can be challenging to compare my experience growing up in a relatively comfortable, middle class community to the experiences of the children and families I've met in my job — many who live in underinvested communities in our nation's capital. My St. Mary experience taught me to listen, learn and respect others. And more importantly — I took to heart what Jesus modeled, that helping others and being part of a strong community is more important than wealth or material goods.

Q: Can you reflect back on your days as a student of St. Mary School...what fond memories do you have? Did you have a favorite teacher?

A: I don't think I can name just one favorite teacher, but will happily give a shout-out to Mr. Hogan who started as a teacher when I was in middle school. I loved my science classes with him!

Q: How do you feel St. Mary School prepared you for the future?

A: St. Mary's small classroom environment allowed a more direct, hands-on approach to learning. But I think I learned the most from my classmates – thinking and asking questions and growing up together.

Q: Do you keep in contact with any of your classmates?



A: I kept in touch with many during high school and college, but slowly drifted apart as the years and miles came between us. Thankfully, social media helped me to reconnect with some classmates over the years. It's been fun to see how far we've all traveled and where life has taken us! And I find that we sometimes pick up a random conversation on social media as if no time passed. (Hiya Class of '95!)

It helps if you know where they are coming from so you can **show them how Jesus' teachings are relevant here and now instead of just looking back at something written 2000 years ago.** Also, showing that it's not just about being good, but also about being happy will help a lot in getting them back on track. Try getting involved in their lives as much as possible instead of just preaching to them from outside (not everyone likes being preached at). You might find out that this actually does work better than just talking about religion all the time because you're part of their daily lives now.

Robert T. Healey Sr. considered the revitalization of Catholic schools to be his personal ministry and eventual legacy. A lawyer, CEO and entrepreneur who founded and led many successful enterprises, he established the Healey Education Foundation in 2004 to bring sound business principles to the challenges of revitalizing Catholic schools. In earlier days, many knew of his philanthropic work through the signature Catholic School Development Program. Since then, the Healey Education Foundation has partnered with more than 200 elementary and high schools across 10 dioceses in Delaware, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania to support initiatives in enrollment management, development, governance and strategic planning.

St. Mary School was one of the first schools in the Diocese of Camden to benefit from Mr. Healey's vision and the Catholic Schools Development Program (now the Healey Education Foundation). In 2004 St. Mary's adopted the Advancement process and its methodology. Fast forward 19 years and we can reflect on the St. Mary School success story thanks to this special partnership with the Healey Education Foundation, the dedication of school leadership, the School Board of Limited Jurisdiction, the faculty and staff and the families that make up the St. Mary School community.

Through this partnership, St. Mary School won many awards for modeling the strategies taught to us by Mr. Healey and the Healey Education Foundation.

Those awards are:

\$10,000 Founder's Grant for being an Entrepreneurial School sustaining best business practices by: leveraging human resources, empowering staff, faculty, laity, volunteers, parents; demonstrating the ability to be nimble and adapt to a changing environment; and growth through calculated risk: analysis, strategy and execution.

St. Mary School continues to be nimble & think outside the box by introducing a new full-time Coordinator of Catholic Identity as part of the faculty.

St. Mary School has been blessed with the opportunity to hire a Coordinator of Catholic Identity. Mrs. Alison Filion works with Mr. Steven P. Hogan, Principal to strengthen the Catholic Identity of the school. She plans prayer services and Masses for the school as well as developing retreat programs for students and faculty. She also coordinates service learning for the various grade levels.

Mrs. Filion teaches religion to grades 5-8 daily. This allows her the opportunity to focus on the spiritual growth of the middle school students and aid them in developing a personal relationship with Christ and the Church. Mrs. Filion serves as a role model for students as they strive to build and deepen their relationship with Jesus. Mrs. Filion's past work as a Director of Campus Ministry at Stockton University positions her to develop the religious life of students and faculty at St. Mary School.



In keeping with Mr. Healey's vision, we introduce you to the SCHOOL BOARD OF LIMITED JURSIDICTION AND THE ADVANCEMENT METHODOLGY

The St. Mary School Board of Limited Jurisdiction is comprised of mission-driven leaders who think and act strategically. The board is a decision-making body with bias for action that formulates and enacts policies, drives fiscal management and is hands-on and goal driven. Areas of concentration are: Financial oversight • Board governance, orientation, culture, evaluations • Principal selection, evaluations • Enrollment • Development • Strategic short- and long-range planning.

The board is comprised of 15-21 voting members representative of the community school and parishes. Membership includes the Pastor, Principal, Advancement Director and 7-9 members of the community. Only 1/3 of the members can be current parents.

The School Board Chair is the leader of the board who consults regularly with the principal (and Pastor when appropriate) to anticipate and strategize issues, concerns and priorities related to school mission. The chair meets regularly with Principal to collaborate on the school, Board vision and plans. The Board Chair presides over all Board meetings, is the spokesperson for the board and manages/oversees Board and Board members.

The School Board Vice Chair serves as proxy for Board Chair as needed • In conjunction with Board Chair, assures attendance at all committee-level meetings • With Chair, serves as expert on Operating Principles • Chairs the Governance Committee.









The Pastor performs Board member roles, responsibilities • Actively promotes school to parish community • Ensures that school is integrated into overall education mission of the Church • Works to integrate any regional parishes in the life of the school.

The Principal serves as an ex-officio, non-voting member of the Board who attends all committee meetings • Responsible for implementing the Board's plans and managing daily activities of the school • Acts as liaison between the Board and school • Maintains a trusted relationship with Board Chair through regular weekly phone calls and/or meetings.


